CREATE "HANDS FREE" DOORS

To prevent the need for touching door handles, create a foot bracket that can be bolted onto the bottom of the door. This allows the door to be opened with someone's foot instead of with their hands.

Hang signs on the door notifying people of the change (see next slide for printable sign)






USE FOOT BRACKET AT BOTTOM OF DOOR.



CREATE "HANDS FREE" DOORS

Create or source a tool for your employees that allows them to open sliding cooler doors without having to use their hands.

Or keep a box of wipes/paper towels next to coolers.



CREATE "HANDS FREE" DOORS

Identify doors within your facility that can simply be left open so employees don't ever have to touch them. Prop them open with door jams, cinder blocks or anything else you can find that is heavy enough to keep it open.

Select doors that can be kept open and/or that are pulled open by multiple people throughout the day.

Do not prop open doors that should be kept closed for security or privacy reasons.
